PREREQUISITES

COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course will be a study of the Seerah (biography) of the Prophet 😹, focusing on the period after migration until his demise. This course provides a comprehensive analysis of the Prophet's life in Madinah, focusing on key events, social dynamics, and political developments. Students will gain insights into the establishment of Islamic governance, defense mechanism, spreading the message and all the challenges they faced in the process.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

- 1. Gain insights into the development of Islamic governance and societal structures during the Madinan phase of Prophet Muhammad's Seerah.
- 2. Analyze diplomatic efforts, interfaith relations, and treaties enacted by the Prophet, offering lessons in diplomacy and peaceful coexistence.
- 3. Extract principles of community building, conflict resolution, and leadership from the Madinan phase Seerah, applicable to modern societal challenges.
