PREREQUISITES

COURSE DESCRIPTION

Muslim scholars have classified the Islamic Sciences into three spheres:

1. The sphere of *islām*: This is represented by the legal sciences, studied under the umbrella of Fiqh
2. The sphere of *īmān*: This is represented by the theological sciences, studied under the umbrella of Aqida
3. The sphere of *iḥsān*: This is represented by the spiritual sciences, studied under the umbrella of Tazkiya

Tazkiya is the discipline that is concerned with cleansing [*takhliya*] and adorning [*taḥliya*] the inner character [*bāṭin*] of the human being, in compliance with the divine commands.

- How do you reach the level where you can “worship Allah as though you see Him, for if you don’t see Him, He sees you?”
- How do you reach the level of *mushābada* (witnessing), where you witness Allah in everything that happens within you, to you, and around you?
- How do you reach the level of *murāqaba* (watchfulness), where you are acutely aware of Allah’s watch over your inner states and outer actions?

The science of Tazkiya teaches us about those levels, how to reach them, and the stations that we must traverse before we can get to them.

COURSE OBJECTIVE

To learn about the spiritual stations that the seeker must aspire to reach in the quest to achieve spiritual excellence [*iḥsān*].
